



Two approaches discussed in today's session

Approach developed by Richard Anker and Martha Anker

Approach based on existing poverty lines

Two general points



'Decency' is a normative concept, as is 'household needs.'

There are national and international norms and guidelines to help inform the operationalization of this concept.

Any approach to measurement involves choices... about how to define 'decency' and how to measure it in practice.

There is no one 'right' approach, but methodological choices do matter, and alignment on concepts and measurement has some advantages.

Estimating the cost of a decent standard of living for households – using the Anker methodology



A coalition of seven sustainability standards covering multiple sectors and products, with the ISEAL Alliance

Working together to measure, promote, and implement a living wage in the sectors in which they are active

As a first step, the Coalition agreed on one approach to defining and measuring living wage – a methodology developed by Richard Anker and Martha Anker



A living wage is...
```

"The remuneration received for a standard work week by a worker in a particular place sufficient to afford a **decent standard of living** for the worker and her or his family.

Elements of a decent standard of living include food, water, housing, education, health care, transport, clothing, and other essential needs including provision for unexpected events."







The first step in the Anker & Anker living wage methodology is to estimate the **cost of a decent standard of living** for a typical household in a particular place

> That is what we want for our living income measurement efforts too






*Decent housing (local norms, Intl standards ILO, WHO, UN Habitat, other) *Field data collection

Generally 5% can vary Is this approach equally applicable to farming households?



Yes!

The estimate of the cost of a decent standard of living for a household of a certain size is the **same for all households of that size in that particular place** irrespective of what their livelihood activities look like.



Can we apply the estimates produced in living wage studies that use the Anker & Anker approach to farming households?


A group of us are currently working on this question 30 Benchmark studies are finished or under way by the GLWC

Important considerations


Geographic scope of the estimate: always sub-national; may be rural, peri-urban, urban



Final methodological point

From cost of a decent standard of living to the income need to cover those costs....

Earning a living income means having the *net annual income* required to afford a decent standard of living



Taxes may vary by livelihood activity

Value of using this methodology -beyond the calculation

- > Building understanding and buy-in through:
 - Field data collection for some components
 - Stakeholder engagement
 - Verification workshops
